Sub: Withdrawal of permission of a period not exceeding five year and grant of Conditional Permission to the “Sheth JP Govt. Ayurved College, Opp. Sardar Baug, Panvadi, Bhavanagar- 364001, Gujrat” with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2019-20 under section 13A/13C of the IMCC Act, 1970- reg.

Sir/Madam,

I am directed to refer to the Ministry's order No. R.17011/23/2016- EP (IM-1) dated 22.09.2016 related to admission matter for a period not exceeding 5 years from the academic session 2016-17 to 2020-21 intimating that the college shall maintain all the Requirements of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as per extant regulations *in toto* during the permission period (2016-17 to 2020-21).

2. The CCIM had carried out an inspection of the institution on 27-28.03.2019 to reassess the available facilities of teaching and practical training as well as to verify the compliance submitted by the college and forwarded its recommendations and report to the Ministry. On examining the same, it was observed that the said college is not fulfilling all the norms of notified Regulations for granting permission for a period of five years (100% criteria). However, the said college is fulfilling all the norms for granting conditional permission (permission for a period of one year) for the academic year 2019-20, as per Regulation 3 of the “Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016”, provisions under the IMCC Act, 1970, relevant regulations made thereunder and as per approved Standard Operative Procedures (SOPs) for 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course.

3. Therefore, it has been decided by the Central Government to withdraw permission granted for a period not exceeding 5 years from the academic session 2016-17 to 2020-21 vide orders dated 22.09.2016 and to grant Conditional Permission to “Sheth JP Govt. Ayurved College, Opp. Sardar Baug, Panvadi, Bhavanagar- 364001, Gujrat” with 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2019-20 under Section 13C/13A of the IMCC Act, 1970.

4. It is further informed that 15% of undergraduate of the permitted intake capacity of 60 UG seats shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quotas shall be conducted by the Central Government and counseling for the remaining 85% seats shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State. If any seats are not filled up in the Central Counseling, the same shall be transferred to the said Counseling Authority to admit students as per their rules/ reservation policies/norms. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the Central counseling for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**

5. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under IMCC Act & Regulations made thereunder.

6. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of CCIM and the Central Government.

7. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2019 to get permission for the session 2020-21:


- (i) all the Requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
- (ii) all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda); and
- (iii) all the requirements under the provisions of the IMCC Act, 1970 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled *in toto*;

8. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to CCIM under intimation to this

Ministry. The CCIM will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled by means of an inspection and submit a report along with its assessment in this matter to the Ministry of AYUSH for considering the permission matter from the academic session 2020-21.



Sir/Madam,

I am directed to refer to the Ministry's letter No. L.14014/230/2019-EP (IM-1) dated 03.07.2019 related to admission matter for the academic year 2020-21, intimating certain requirements to be fulfilled by the college for consideration of permission for the academic session 2020-21.

2. Further, refer to the CCIM's letter No.Ref. 26-24/2020-college dated 25.09.2020 forwarding therewith recommendation of the college to the Central Government based on thorough examination of the visitation report Part-I, indemnity bond, affidavit & latest details of teaching, non-teaching and hospital staff submitted by the college along with the assessment report, as the physical verification by conduction of inspection could not be carried out in view of present COVID-19 pandemic situation for the A.Y. 2020-21. On examining the same in terms of Regulation 3 of the “Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016”, provisions under the IMCC Act, 1970, relevant regulations made thereunder, it is found that the College is fulfilling notified and approved criterion for granting Conditional Permission for UG (BAMS) course.


3. It has, therefore, been decided by the Central Government to grant Conditional Permission to Govt. Seth JP Ayurveda Medical College, Opp. Sardar Bag, Pandavi, Bhavnagar-364001, Gujarat for conducting 75 seats (including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2020-21 under Section 13C/13A of the IMCC Act, 1970.

4. It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate of the permitted intake capacity of 75 UG (BAMS) seats shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quotas shall be conducted by the Central Government and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State. If any seats are not filled up in the Central Counseling, the same shall be transferred to the said Counseling Authority to admit students as per their rules/ reservation policies/norms. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the Central counseling for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**



Sub: Grant of conditional permission to the Sheth JP Govt. Ayurved College, Opp. Sardar Baug, Panvadi, Bhavanagar-364001, Gujarat (Inst. ID. AYU0028) with 75 seats (including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course under section 28/29 of NCISM Act 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder for the academic session 2021-22 - reg.

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provisions of National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government notified that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. In view of the above the Central Government constituted the Autonomous Boards with effect from 11th June, 2021 and as per regulation 59 (2) of The National Commission for Indian System of Medicine ACT, 2020, Medical standards, requirements and other provisions of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 and the rules and regulations made thereunder shall continue to be in force and operate till new standards or requirements are specified under this Act or the rules and regulations made thereunder.

Further, the provision of concerned regulations which are inconsistent with the provision of NCISM ACT 2020 shall not be applicable.

2. However, GOI, Ministry of AYUSH vide its letter no. L.14011/3/2020-EP (1) dated 26.03.2021 and 15.04.2021 Issued Relaxation/support policy for ASU&S colleges in unprecedented times of COVID-19 pandemic for the academic session 2021-22 and the permission for the academic year 2021-22 of the ASU&S colleges will be considered on the basis of part-I visitation proforma submitted by the college provided that the college shall submit an undertaking & indemnity bond, stating that they shall fulfill respective requirements in terms of required teaching and training facilities specified in the relevant regulations throughout the academic year".

Further, in view of above, the college has been assessed on the basis of Relaxation policy issued by the Ministry of AYUSH and on examining in terms of Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016, provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, it is found that the College is fulfilling notified and approved criteria for Granting Conditional Permission for UG (BAMS) course for A.Y. 2021-22.

Further, On examining the same, certain deficiencies have been observed and therefore, under section 28/29 of NCISM Act 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, an opportunity of hearing was granted to the college on **17.09.2021** to present the case through virtual mode.

On the basis of observations of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and affidavit dated 20.10.2021 submitted by the Director, Dept. of AYUSH, Gujarat, it has been decided by the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine **to grant Conditional Permission to Sheth JP Govt. Ayurved College, Opp. Sardar Baug, Panvadi, Bhavanagar-364001, Gujarat (Inst. ID. AYU0028) for conducting 75 seats (Including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2021-22 subject to the following conditions:-**

- I. The fulfillment of conditions as specified in the Undertaking/Indemnity bond submitted by the college.
- II. The college shall submit an undertaking in the form of affidavit duly notarized within one month explaining the details of providing EPF and ESI facilities to the teaching, non-teaching staff of the Colleges/Hospitals and regularly paying the same as per the provisions of Employees' Provident Funds and Miscellaneous Provisions Act, 1952 & ESI Act, 1948 and relevant Rules and Regulations.
4. It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 75 UG (BAMS) seats (including EWS) shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2021-22 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.
5. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
6. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
7. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2021 to get permission for the session 2022-23:

- (i) all the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for undergraduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
- (ii) all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda);
- (iii) all the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto; and
- (iv) all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016 for grant of permission to PG courses.

8. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission from the academic session 2022-23.

ID-AYU0028) regarding permission with 60 seats (75 including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of the NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2022-23 and relevant regulations thereunder in respect of appeal dated 03.11.2022-regarding.

Sir/Madam,

With reference to the subject mentioned above, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the provision of National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020, the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) has been repealed with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021. With effect from the said date, the Central Council of Indian Medicine constituted under sub-division (1) of section 3 of the Indian Medicine Central Council Act, 1970 (48 of 1970) shall stand dissolved. Now, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (3) of the section 1 of the said Act, the Central Government hereby notifies that all the provisions of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine Act, 2020 has been come into force with effect from the 11th day of June, 2021.

1. This is with reference to the first appeal filed by Mr. Manoj Agarwal, The Additional Chief Secretary, Health & Family Welfare Department, Govt. of Gujarat vide letter ref. no. ACS/HFWD/PS-80/2022 dated 03.11.2022 to the commission in respect of denial of conditional permission issued to the Government colleges of Gujarat namely State Model Institute of Ayurveda Sciences, Kolavada, Gandhinagar-382028, Gujarat (Inst. ID- AYU0373), Sheth JP Govt. Ayurved College, Opp. Sardar Baug, Panvadi, Bhavanagar- 364001, Gujarat (Inst. ID-AYU0028), Govt. Akhandanand Ayurved College & Hospital, Lal Darwaja, Bhadra, Ahmedabad- 380001, Gujarat (Inst. ID AYU0024), Govt. Ayurved College, Pancheshwar Road, Near Geeta Cinema, Junagadh-362001, Gujarat (Inst. ID-AYU0029) for conducting UG and PG courses as the case may be due to not fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria in terms of Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016" and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder due to non availability of teaching, non-teaching staff, hospital staff and other shortcoming as mentioned in denial orders dated 19.10.2022.
2. Thereafter the said appeal was placed before the Chairman, NCISM and Chairman NCISM constituted a Hearing Committee and provided an opportunity of hearing to the college. Accordingly, the letter was sent to The Additional Chief Secretary, Health & Family Welfare vide commission letter no. NCISM/Comm./Appeal/(2022-23) dated 04.11.2022 to appear before the designated hearing committee as constituted by the Chairman, NCISM on 04.11.2022 in respect of appeal filed under section 10(1)(g) and documents/records/ proof to substantiate the claims and make written submission and submit an authenticated copy of evidence/verifications to commission with shortcoming wise clarifications mentioned in the denial orders dated 19.10.2022 passed by 04.11.2022 at 05:30 PM and on behalf of all Government colleges of Gujarat, Mr. Manoj Aggarwal, Addl. Chief Secretary H&FWD, Deputy Secretary Ayush and Director AYUSH, attended the hearing.
3. The hearing committee sought clarification from the representatives of Gujarat Government regarding shortcomings mentioned in the denial orders dated 19.10.2022 passed by the Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM, which is as under:-

S. No.	Shortcoming	Submission made by Govt. of Gujarat in the Appeal letter
1.	(i) Availability of Total Teaching staff is 83.33% against the minimum requirement of 90% as required in Schedule V of MSR 2016. (ii) Availability of Non-Teaching staff is 64% against the minimum requirement of 80% as required in Schedule VI of MSR 2016. (iii) Availability of Hospital staff is 78% against the minimum requirement of 80% as required in Schedule IV of MSR 2016. (iv) Mean of general and essential equipments/instruments availability is 54.88% which is not fulfilling minimum criteria as required in Regulation 3 (iii) of MSR 2016.	NCISM has denied the permission of Government Ayurveda colleges of Ahmedabad, Junagadh, Bhavnagar and Kolvada (Gandhinagar) for the session 2022-23. General election to Legislative Assembly of Gujarat, 2022 and Model code of Conduct has come into force. So, in this condition fast action regarding appointment from Govt. side is likely to be delayed. In the good faith of education of students, it is our humble request and sincere appeal to Grant permission to our colleges of Gujarat for the academic year 2022-23.

The submission made by the Govt. of Gujarat was placed before the designated hearing committee and hearing committee sought clarification regarding the shortcomings mentioned in the denial orders dated 19.10.2022 and also asked for the compliance of Shortcomings and asked the representatives to submit the affidavit regarding their assurance in respect of fulfilment of all requisite as mentioned in the denial orders.
5. In response of the same. The Deputy Secretary, H&FWD, Gujarat submitted the affidavit vide letter no. AYD/102022/SFS-8/CHH on 05.11.2022 with the affirmation that Govt. of Gujarat will fulfill all shortcomings with regards to Non-Availability of Teaching, Non-Teaching, Hospital staff, less availability of general and essential equipments/instruments and other shortcomings mentioned in the denial orders issued to the government colleges of Gujarat. The Deputy Secretary, H&FWD, Gujarat also affirms that they will appoint new Teaching, Non-Teaching, Hospital staff within stipulated time period i.e., 45 days.
6. Hence, in view of the affidavit submitted by the Deputy Secretary, H&FWD, Gujarat vide letter no. AYD/102022/SFS-8/CHH on 05.11.2022, the Chairman, NCISM directed the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM vide no. NCISM/Comm./Appeal/(2022-23) dated 09.11.2022 to grant conditional permission to **Sheth JP Govt. Ayurved College, Opp. Sardar Baug, Panvadi, Bhavanagar- 364001, Gujarat (Inst. ID-AYU0028)** under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2022-23.
7. Therefore, it has been decided by the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM to issue conditional permission to **Sheth JP Govt. Ayurved College, Opp. Sardar Baug, Panvadi, Bhavanagar- 364001, Gujarat (Inst. ID-AYU0028)** regarding permission with 60 seats (75 including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of the NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2022-23 on the basis of affidavit vide letter no. AYD/102022/SFS-8/CHH dated 05.11.2022 submitted by the Deputy secretary, H&FWD, Gujarat, subject to following condition:-
 - (i) It is further informed that minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 60 seats (75 seats including EWS) shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2022-23 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
8. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
9. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
10. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2022 and send a compliance report to **permission for the session 2023-24:**
 - i) all the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016;
 - ii) all the requirements of the Indian Medicine Central Council (Minimum Standards of Education in Indian Medicine) Amendment Regulations, 2016 (for Ayurveda);
 - iii) all the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in to; and
11. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission from the academic session 2023-24.

ID-AYU0028) inspection of your College was conducted on 02.05.2023 & 03.05.2023 on Hybrid mode as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and rating Board, NCISM to process the Conditional Permission with 60 seats (75 including EWS) for the academic session 2023-24 under Section 28 of NCISM ACT 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder.

2. Further, in view of above, the visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulation namely, the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", The Indian Medicine Central Council (Post Graduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations, 2016 and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under. In view of above, the assessment report was placed in the **83th Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) on **15.03.2024**. On careful examination of the assessment report, considering the deficiencies observed therein as mentioned above the college was given an opportunity of virtual hearing vide the MARBISM letter (Hearing notice) of **even no. dated 27.05.2024** to appear on **04.06.2024** before the designated Hearing Committee to present their case and to show cause as to **why not the conditional permission to your college with Sheth JP Govt. Ayurved College, Opp. Sardar Baug, Panvadi, Jashonath Chowk, Bhavnagar- 364001, Gujarat (Inst. ID. AYU0028) with 60 seats (75 seats including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act 2020 be denied for the Academic Year 2024-25.**

3. The college was directed to make written submission in respect of the case and produce all relevant valid documents/records/proof against all the deficiencies/shortcomings as indicated above. The representatives of the college submitted written submissions **vide ref no. JPC/MKM/2049/2024 dated 29.05.2024** against the deficiencies conveyed to them. Whereas, the college through its representatives, **Principal, Dr. Naresh Kumar Jain** appeared before the Hearing Committee on **04.06.2024** and made their submission virtually as well as written submission against the shortcomings communicated to the college. The shortcomings communicated to the college, submission made by the representatives of the Ayurveda college and observations made by the Hearing Committee are as under:-

The observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report of the NCISM have been carefully re-examined in terms of Regulation 3 of the "Indian Medicine Central Council (Requirements of Minimum Standard for under-graduate Ayurveda Colleges and attached Hospitals) Regulations, 2016", and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, and the recommendation of Hearing Committee was placed in the **93th Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) **held on 13.06.2024.**
5. In view of the observation of Hearing Committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report has been carefully examined in terms of concerned Regulation and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder, and the **board concluded that the college is not fulfilling the notified & approved criteria for issuance of Grant of Conditional Permission to Sheth JP Govt. Ayurved College, Opp. Sardar Baug, Panvadi, Jashonath Chowk, Bhavnagar- 364001, Gujarat (Inst. ID. AYU0028) for intake capacity with 60 seats (75 seats including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course. However, Board decided to issue conditional permission as per the approved Seat Reduction Policy in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020 for failing to maintain the minimum essential standards for the Academic year 2024-25.**

For UG course:-

*"For deficiency of **every one teacher**, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 5% of total intake capacity."*

*There is deficiency of 01 teacher for issuance of conditional permission for academic session 2024-25 as per Schedule-V Note (iii) of MSR 2016. **Therefore, in accordance of Reduction policy 2024-2025, for deficiency of every one teacher, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by 5% of total intake capacity.***

*"For non availability of **computerized Central Registration system** seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by one seat"*

*"For every 10% deficiency in **instruments**, seat reduction in the intake capacity shall be considered by reducing the intake strength by one seat."*

*Accordingly, after applying the seat reduction policy 2024-25 under section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act 2020 college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of **conditional permission with 55 seats (69 seats including EWS) instead of 60 seats (75 seats including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2024-25.***

Therefore, in view of shortcomings and deficiencies mentioned as above, **Conditional Permission is issued to the Sheth JP Govt. Ayurved College, Opp. Sardar Baug, Panvadi, Jashonath Chowk, Bhavnagar- 364001, Gujarat (Inst. ID. AYU0028) for intake capacity with 55 seats (69 seats including EWS) instead of 60 seats (75 seats including EWS) in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2024-25.**

- i. It is further informed that minimum **15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 55 seats (69 seats including EWS) instead of 60 seats (75 seats including EWS)** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2024-25 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**
8. Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
9. Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.

10. The following requirements should be fulfilled by the college by 31st December, 2023 and send a compliance report to get permission for the academic session 2025-26:
- All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled in toto.
 - All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
 - All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
11. The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college to President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2025-26.
